

## **Information on Brexit in English**

Dear Sir or Madam,

The United Kingdom will leave the European Union according to the current timetable soon. It is still not known whether there will be a no-deal or a deal scenario.

In order to ensure an efficient handling of the process for UK residents, The Munich Foreigners' Office is fully prepared for all possible eventualities.

### ***What does a no-deal mean for you?***

In a no-deal scenario, you will need a residency title for Germany. There will be a transition period of 3 months, starting on 13<sup>th</sup> April 2019. During this transition period you can continue working and living in Germany as before. However, you will have to make an appointment with the Foreigners' Office **from 15<sup>th</sup> April 2019 onwards.**

Furthermore, there is a link to book an appointment from 15<sup>th</sup> April 2019 onwards. Alternatively, you can make an appointment via our telephone number 233-96010.

**Please note: it is not possible to book an appointment before 15<sup>th</sup> April 2019, neither online nor via phone.**

During the appointment, we will discuss which residency title you are eligible for. Also, you will receive a certificate, which proves that you can work in Germany and that you are a legitimate resident.

On our homepage, you can also find information about the possibilities to acquire German citizenship.

### ***What does a deal mean for you?***

You do not need an appointment for now. In this case, please check the latest status via our homepage.

***What does Brexit mean for your UK driving licence?***

In the event of a no-deal scenario your UK driving licence may no longer be valid in Germany as of 13<sup>th</sup> April 2019. If you hold a UK driving licence, you should apply for an exchange to a German driving licence before 13<sup>th</sup> April 2019 at the
